

WANT TO BECOME A TEACHER?

Which path is best for you...



1.

Traditional Undergraduate

Candidates can earn their bachelor's degree and a preliminary teaching license in four years. Admittance to the program takes place in the spring of Sophomore year.

2.

Evening Undergraduate

With the adult learner in mind, candidates can complete the program in as little as two years and leave with a bachelor's degree and a preliminary teaching license.

3.

Double Major

The double major is an opportunity for candidates to earn two bachelor's degrees, concurrently; a degree in education with a focus at the secondary level and a content-specific degree.

4.

Undergraduate + Graduate

The 4 + 1 option is available to candidates wishing to earn both their UG and GRAD degrees in five years. Candidates selecting this pathway will be eligible for a preliminary teaching license and a specialty endorsement.

5.

Master of Arts in Teaching

For those who already hold, or are working toward, a bachelor's degree, candidates can select a one or two-year program to earn a Master of Arts degree in teaching and a preliminary license.

6.

Master's in Education

Licensed teachers who wish to earn a graduate degree can do so while also adding a specialty endorsement to their license by enrolling in the one-year M.Ed. program.
